Cork Foundation, a new not-for-profit funding orestablished ganisation by a group of business and public figures to help drive social and economic growth throughout the Cork region, was launched this week. The Cork Foundation has an initial target to raise €5 million, with an aim to connect contributors from home and abroad directly to Cork businesses and community enterprises.
